1 2ww referral forms

We can now confirm that the new forms have now gone live **as of Tuesday 31** January 2023.

The new referral forms have been uploaded to the IT system that you use. The forms can also be accessed through the <u>Transformation Partners in Health and Care</u> <u>website</u>.

The <u>Frequently Asked Questions webpage</u> includes information addressing common queries regarding the forms, including ways to avoid common technical problems.

It is important that you only use the new, updated USC referral forms after 31 January 2023. Please could you ensure that any old forms or templates are removed from your IT system and are no longer used for patient referrals.

2 Cancer 2WW Referrals (Barts Health)

The following 2WW services at Royal London are experiencing delays with patients being seen within 14 days:

- Urology
- Head & Neck (ENT)

Please inform your patients being referred for these 2WW services that there may be a delay and add to safety netting systems to ensure patients tracked.

Barts Health has started the annual update of the Directory of Services (DOS), the named tumour groups above have had alert added to highlight delay, whilst mitigation plans are in place.

3 Cancer 2WW Referrals (BHRUT)

BHRUT is receiving high volumes of urgent suspected cancer **dermatology/skin** referrals. The Dermatology Service also has reduced consultant capacity due to retirement and change of roles, and for these reasons there are delays in patients being first seen.

BHRUT advises GPs that patients may have to wait longer than 14 days to be seen for their first appointment. However, BHRUT has put additional admin resource in the Cancer Referral Office to manage patient's queries regarding future appointments.

BHRUT has now embarked on tele dermatology clinics to manage the backlog with dedicated clinics every week. Please inform your patients that once on the USC/2ww pathway they may receive communications to attend the medical photography first.

Thank you for your support during this challenging period and thank you for your help in advising patients of the delays at point of referral.

4 Improvement to colorectal referrals

Many thanks to GPs and practice staff who have been submitting FIT results with a 2ww colorectal referral. For referrals to Barts Health, over 98% of patients are now being referred with a FIT result. This ensures delays to the patient pathway are reduced.

We have built solid processes to manage this through more collaborative working. We took on this work at the start of the pandemic to issue FIT to patients, and been working closely with them to ensure referrals come back in. This means providers can prioritise the most high-risk patients. **Please continue to ensure a FIT result is included when referring to the colorectal pathway.**

5 Targeted Lung Health Check Programme update

We continue to scan residents from practices in Barking & Dagenham. We will be expanding the programme to other areas in north east London and the timeline for this is to be confirmed. We will keep you updated on plans for this.

The Muslim Sisterhood is helping us to increase the uptake of cervical screening amongst Muslim women, and their video now has over <u>100,000 views</u>.
