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2ww (going forward referred to as Urgent Suspected Cancer - USC) referral forms

Please make sure you are only using the new 2ww referral forms (which went live on 31 January 2023). More information is on our web page.


2 EMIS practices to associate the SNOMED code to the incoming FIT report.

As part of the Investment and Impact Fund (IIF), all fast-track referrals for suspected lower gastrointestinal cancer must be accompanied by a FIT result (faecal immunochemical test result), received either one week prior to the referral or in the two weeks after.

We have noticed activity in this area is low in some areas, and it appears to be because the FIT results are coming back into EMIS without an associated code. For this reason, practices need to take two actions:

- Associate a code with the incoming FIT results so these will be coded automatically upon receipt in future. We have written instructions on how to do this: <u>How to associate a code with incoming</u> <u>FIT results</u>.
- Code previous FIT results, received on or after 11 March 2023, with: Quantitative faecal immunochemical test (Concept ID: 1049361000000101, Description ID: 2643291000000112). You can use the following CEG search to find affected records:

3 Reminder: IIF requirements for FIT testing

For IIF indicator CAN-02, the window for recording a FIT test result is **up to 21 days prior to a two week wait referral**. FIT results recorded after referral will not count towards your achievement.

However, delaying a referral for suspected cancer until the FIT test is back relies on practices having very firm safety netting processes in place. We suggest you discuss these processes internally at your practice now. Here are some of the CEG resources that can help: Cancer Toolkit.

4 2ww update: Head and Neck (Barts Health)

The team has made significant progress over the past month with regards to reducing the number of patients awaiting a 2WW H&N appointment. We no longer have a backlog of patients awaiting triage.

We currently have 26 patients awaiting an appointment. This time last month (12/04) we had 168 patients awaiting an appointment, so have seen an 83% reduction in our waiting list in the course of a month.

5 Free online course on skin cancer diagnosis for salaried GPs (TNW only)

Barts Health NHS Trust and NEL ICB are offering an <u>online course</u> on skin cancer diagnosis for salaried GPs. 6 SUMMIT Study comes to an end

The SUMMIT Study, which has been offering lung health checks and CT scans to GP-registered patients in north central and north east London since 2019, ends on 25 May 2023. No further checks will be provided under this research. Eligible SUMMIT participants will be invited at the appropriate time to have a Targeted Lung Health Check (see below).

The main SUMMIT research is due for publication in the autumn and there will be further communication at the time. The study organisers and researchers at UCLH and UCL are hugely grateful for the support from primary care for this important screening study.

7 North East London Cancer Alliance tops performance standards

We have great performance statistics for February and March, being the best cancer alliance nationally in number of published metrics.

Also, for the whole of 2022 to 2023, we were either top performer or second top performer in 9 out of 10 cancer waiting times standards, such as 2WW, Faster Diagnosis Standard and 31 Day First Treatment.
