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## 1 Early Cancer Diagnosis DES

The NEL cancer GP clinical leads have developed a practical and pragmatic support guide for delivering the early diagnosis PCN DES and quality outcome framework.

## 9 National Cancer Patient Experience Survey Results

The <u>latest results</u>, released this month, show that cancer patients have given a rating of 8.88 out of 10 for their overall experience. Results relating to GPs are as follows:

- 74% of NEL patients who had contacted their GP practice said they only spoke to a primary care professional once or twice before cancer diagnosis, as opposed to more numerous visits to the GP before diagnosis (against a national score of 77.7%).
- 60% of patients who had contacted their GP practice said that the referral for diagnosis was explained in a way they could completely understand (against a national score of 65.4%).
- 21% of patients said they have had a review of cancer care by their GP practice (against a national score of 20.7%, an increase from 18.0% in 2021).
