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
Why Lung Health Checks?



The NHS Long Term Plan: transforming cancer care

Two ambitions set by the government. By 2028:

- An extra 55,000 people each year will survive for five years or more following their cancer diagnosis.
- Three in four cancers (75%) will be diagnosed at an early stage.
- Without non-symptomatic screening 28.9% of lung cancers are diagnosed at stages one and two*.

What is a Targeted Lung Health Check?



The TLHC programme is open to people aged between 55 and 74 who have 'ever smoked'. These people are sent a letter to invite them to a check.

The programme has two main parts:

Lung health check


- Participants are asked questions about their lifestyle, breathing, family and medical history
- Height and weight measurements are recorded
- Referred for smoking cessation support
- Virtual/telephone triage

Low dose CT scan

- o Based on the outcome of the lung health check, the participant might be invited for a chest scan
- A low dose CT scan that takes a detailed picture of the participant's lungs
- o If the results show anything concerning, the participant is referred for follow-up scans or treatment
- o Participants receive a 24 month follow up scan




Number of lung cancers diagnosed Apr 19 - Apr 23

Key achievements



- TLHC programme went live in NEL in July 2022 in Barking & Dagenham and June 2023 in Tower Hamlets.
- Service running 8am-7pm Monday to Sunday
- Uptake rate is 78%, which is well above the national average of 42%
- 95% of patients rate their experience as either very good or good: https://www.nelcanceralliance.nhs.uk/news/95-patients-north-east-london-rate-their-lung-health-check-experience-either-very-good-or-good
- The Boroughs were chosen based on the smoking prevalence, lung cancer mortality and geographical infrastructure
- All B&D and TH practices have signed up to the programme
- 21,430 eligible patients have been invited to attend a TLHC appointment
- 10,740 TLHCs have been completed
- 3,580 scans have taken place (local media release/ tweet in place to mark the 500th patient milestone https://www.nelcanceralliance.nhs.uk/news/500th-resident-receives-life-saving-lung-check)

Smoking Prevalence

- The London region smoking prevalence is 11.1%, which is slightly lower than the England prevalence of 12.1%
- Barking and Dagenham, Newham and Tower Hamlets have higher rates of tobacco smokers than both the national and regional average.
- Ranking of NEL boroughs:
 - 1. Barking and Dagenham 15.9%
 - 2. Newham 14.1%
 - 3. Tower Hamlets 13.1%
 - 4. Waltham Forest 11.0%
 - 5. Hackney 10.9%
 - 6. Redbridge 9.4%
 - 7. Havering 9.1%

(data for Dec)




- New Me Healthy Lifestyles (Barking and Dagenham Stop Smoking Services) have now started to collate
 data, requested by NHSE on TLHC referrals to the stop smoking service.
- The table below reflects the data has been collected to date:

Since November 2022:

- No of referrals received 793
- No of referrals offered 161
- No of referrals that took up the Stop Smoking Course – 54

- About 353 people either declined the offer of the course or did not respond to the invitation.
- Out of the 54 people that took up the course, 52 people have a quit date that has been set
- At the end of March New Me Healthy Lifestlyes reported 14 people who successfully completed the stop smoking course

Social media and advertising campaigns

- We are looking to build on and learn from the work we did in Barking & Dagenham to run some awareness campaigns in Tower Hamlets, using a mix of social media and local advertising (such as bus and tube posters, adverts in local papers, leaflets for GPs and pharmacies)
- In Barking & Dagenham we reached 59,593 people via social media, 75,796 through posters and train stations and bus stops and our radio ad was listened to 285,770 times

 We continue to work with local public health, local authority, charity, community and voluntary group partners to raise awareness; identify barriers or concerns; get support in improving our communications to reduce inequalities
