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1 PCN DES support guide

2 PCN cancer facilitators

As a reminder, our PCN cancer facilitators are available to support PCNs to deliver the requirements of early diagnosis PCN DES. The support includes:

- Facilitate quality improvement, including reflection on comparative cancer data, referrals and audits and learning event analysis.
- Support action planning and use of ongoing quality improvement methodologies.
- Facilitate improvement in cancer screening, prevention and early diagnosis.
- Work with the whole team as needed including GPs, nurses, clinical pharmacists, physician associates, other clinicians and non-clinical staff.
- Provide training to staff on cancer screening and cancer related processes such as safety netting.
- Work with PCNs to support a reduction in health inequalities.

3 Urgent Suspected Cancer referrals in the NHS e-Referral Service (e-RS)

As a reminder, the Two Week Wait standards ceased to apply from 1 October 2023, to be replaced by the <u>Faster Diagnosis Standard</u>.

As a result of this, Trusts are removing reference to 2ww (and any variations of this) on e-RS, to be replaced by 'Urgent Suspected Cancer'. This is being done as quickly as possible, but it will take some time and we will keep you updated on progress.

5 Targeted Lung Health Check Programme Update

Many thanks for your continued support for our Targeted Lung Health Check Programme. We continue to have one of the highest uptakes in the country.

It is currently running in Barking & Dagenham and Tower hamlets. The programme offers life-saving scans to residents aged between 55 and 74, and who have ever smoked.

As previously communicated, we will shortly be moving to our next borough to keep the momentum going. This will be Newham, based on a combination of smoking data, current scanner location and IT integration already being in place.

SNOMED Codes

6 Patients on an urgent suspected cancer pathway

Please remind patients that they need to be available for appointments if they have been referred on an urgent suspected cancer pathway. Patients should be informed that they are on this pathway.

Please make sure that they are available for appointments 6-8 weeks after you have made their referral. Patients should also be informed they may be referred for diagnostic tests which are outlined when the referral is made.

7 Genetic testing: how to request this for your patients

Webinar on 9am to 12.30pm on 8 February 2024:

The national genomic test directory enables healthcare professionals outside of clinical genetics to request 'diagnostic' genetic testing at the point of care rather than referring to clinical genetics. This half-day virtual training programme, run by the North Thames Genomic Medicine Service, aims to provide a practical tool-kit for healthcare professionals to request genetic testing.

We will focus on the use of the national genomic test directory, key points to cover during conversation(s) with patients, consenting of patients for genomic testing and communicating genetic test results.
