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1 Improving the Urgent Suspected Cancer Referrals process

Our colleagues across our Trusts have asked if GPs could please help improve the referrals process for patients by:

- Ensuring that blood tests at the point of referral are within 3 months
- Completing and attaching clinical information upon submitting suspected cancer referrals
- Encouraging patients to make themselves available for appointments for their diagnostics and treatment
- Making sure that patients clearly understand that they have been referred due to suspicion of cancer
- Ensuring up to date contact details are available, including email addresses, to support pathway management.

2 Targeted Lung Health Check Programme Update

Many thanks for your continued support for our Targeted Lung Health Check Programme. We continue to have one of the highest uptakes in the country. Our average uptake rate is 52.2% compared to a national average of 44.6.

As of 31 March 2024, we have so far completed 21,925 telephone triages and over 9,000 CT scans. 67.7% of lung cancers found were at stage 1 or stage 2.

It is currently running in **Barking & Dagenham, Tower Hamlets and Newham**. The programme offers life-saving scans to residents aged between 55 and 74, and who have ever smoked.

Urgent message for practices in Newham: if you have not yet done so, please sign the data sharing agreement and respond to InHealth regarding data extraction.

We have had 100% sign up from practices in Barking & Dagenham and Tower Hamlets and we are aiming for the same in Newham.

3 Important update on the Multi-Cancer Blood Test Programme

NHS England has taken the decision to hold off on proceeding with the Multi-Cancer Blood Test Programme, which we were expecting to pilot in north east London.

The rollout of the programme was dependent on receiving positive preliminary first-year data from the NHS-Galleri Trial. Following analysis of this data, NHS England concluded that the data was not compelling enough to warrant further investment at this time. They have instead chosen to wait for the final results of the NHS-Galleri Trial, which will be available in 2026, before considering any future large-scale implementation.

Whilst this is disappointing, it us understandable that any large scale roll out is based on sound evidence and final full-term results.

5 Closure of Jo's Trust

We have been downloading the resources from their website to make sure they are still available to partners across north east London and these will be added to the cancer alliance website in due course.

6 Take action on early diagnosis for ovarian cancer

This year, the Early Diagnosis Network has partnered with Arden's EMIS Web national trainer and Peninsula Cancer Alliance to produce a tailored webinar demonstrating the options and opportunities for setting clinical IT alerts and organising gold standard safety netting for patients with persistent abdominal symptoms (bloating, feeling full quickly and/or loss of appetite, pelvic or abdominal pain and urinary symptoms).
