TLHC 2023-24 Objectives

Cancer Alliances to deliver:

- ✓ 1. Invitation, Lung Health Check (LHC) attendance and CT scan run rates in line with expansion plans agreed with the national team
- ✓ 2. Update of LHCs above 50%
- ✓ 3. A clear plan for further expansion in 2024/25

These align with the National team's objectives:

- 1. To invite 1m people to attend a lung health check (cumulatively covering 24% 30% of the eligible population in England) by 23/24 year end
- 2. To plan to expand TLHC delivery further in 2024/25, and achieve 100% coverage by 28/29
- 3. To raise update of Lung Health Checks above 50% by year end 23/24
- 4. To manage the national evaluation of TLHC programme

What is a Targeted Lung Health Check?



The TLHC programme is open to people aged between 55 and 74 who have 'ever smoked'. These people are sent a letter to invite them to a lung health check.

The programme has two main parts:

Lung health check


- Participants are asked questions about their lifestyle, breathing, family and medical history
- Height and weight measurements are recorded
- Referred for smoking cessation support
- Virtual/telephone triage

Low dose CT scan

- o Based on the outcome of the lung health check, the participant might be invited for a chest scan
- A low dose CT scan that takes a detailed picture of the participant's lungs
- o If the results show anything concerning, the participant is referred for follow-up scans or treatment
- o Participants receive a 24 month follow up scan

TLHC Pathway overview














National programme lung cancer diagnosis data to date

from programe start up until December 2023




















Stop Smoking Update



- Programme nurses are trained to employ the smoking cessation advice and the effects of smoking.
- Participants who are smokers are offered a referral to their local Stop Smoking Services.
 - o To date, 879 referrals were received by local Stop Smoking Services in Barking & Dagenham, Tower Hamlets and Newham.
 - 252 participants took up the stop smoking course (28%) and out of that 86% participants have had a quit date set (219).
 - 85 (33%) participants have successfully completed the course.

Key achievements



- We have successfully been working in partnership with InHealth, Heart & Lung Health, local authorities, GPs, community and voluntary groups and Public Health on a borough-by-borough basis to deliver the Targeted Lung Health Check Programme.
- Programme is running across Barking & Dagenham, Tower Hamlets, and Newham boroughs.
- As of 31 January 2024, we have invited 34,783 patients, completed 18,323 lung health checks and undertaken 7,493 scans!
- Our approach has led to the one of the highest uptake rates in the country we delivered over 1,000 scans in Tower Hamlets, within just two months of launching there.
- Uptake rate is 64%, which is well above the national average of 42%.

- Lung health checks are now being offered to residents in Newham.
- Further comms and engagement to continue with the borough.
- Confirmation of the programme to further expand in 2024/25 has been ratified by NHS England and we will expanding to the next borough, Havering.
- The proposal is to roll out across the whole of NEL by 2028 when it will become a national screening programme.
