1 Non-specific symptoms (NSS) Service Update

3 Improving the quality of support that cancer patients receive

As a reminder – with a deadline extension - an exciting opportunity has arisen to improve the quality of support that cancer patients receive within the primary care setting through a process of reflection and quality improvement at practice level across north east London.

We are keen to support practices to improve how they:

- Explore and identify cancer patients' unmet needs
- Offer support to help meet these needs

We are asking practices to:

- 1. Run a CEG search to identify a maximum of 10 historical random cancer patients
- 2. Import the patients into a Reflection Tool and complete it for each patient
- 3. Reflect as a practice on the results and review the Resources & Recommendations we will be providing
- 4. Submit the anonymised search results and your practice improvement plan on what better support would encompass
- 5. After 2 quarters run the random search again (max 10 patients) and reflect on any changes to the quality of care or support offered
- 6. Send out a patient questionnaire to these patients (which we will have provided) to help the practice reflect on care provided
- 7. Submit a final evaluation form including the second search results, your review of your QI and the anonymised patient feedback results

An external evaluation will be conducted by SoWhat? Consulting Ltd. We will be supporting the practices with the above process and have the backing of the Place-Based Cancer GP leads and PCN Cancer Facilitators who are also keen to support in anyway needed.

We are offering £500 to each GP practice to be involved in this Quality improvement project, and we are aiming for 5 GP practices per area.

7 Gypsy, Roma and Traveller Engagement Project

An exciting new project is planned for 2025! In partnership with Friends, Families and Travelers and Roma Support Group, North East London Cancer Alliance is seeking to recruit and train 15 community health champions to support their local communities to engage with health services.

Cultural awareness training is being offered to all Social Prescribers and GP receptionists in north east London and resources will be made available via The Training Hub/Cancer Academy. 8 Targeted Lung Health Check Programme Update

We have completed over <u>10,000 CT scans and 25,000 telephone triages</u> as part of the Targeted Lung Health Check Programme (a free check for 55-74 year olds who have ever smoked).

Our uptake rate is one of the highest in the country and we are diagnosing over 60% of cancers at stage 1 or stage 2.

Expansion to Havering

We have now launched this in Havering, which follows Barking & Dagenham, Tower Hamlets and Newham (the order of boroughs is determined by smoking prevalence, along with IT integration).

All practices in Havering have been asked to sign a data sharing agreement via their Data Controller Console, and we have written to each practice with instructions. We ask that all practices action this as soon as possible please.

9 Cervical screening in patients with Severe Mental Illness

The <u>NIHR Policy Research Unit in Behavioural and Social Sciences</u> based at Newcastle University is conducting a study that aims to boost cervical screening in patients with Severe Mental Illness (SMI). We are currently looking to involve GP practices in Lambeth to recruit participants.

Summary of the study:

- Nationally, cervical screening rates in patients with SMI is 20% than the general population.
- This study will signpost patients with SMI to advice and support designed specifically for individuals with SMI (a <u>leaflet</u> and <u>animation</u>) through enhanced iPLATO text messages (participating GP practices do not need to be signed up to iPLATO to take part).
- We have collaborated with researchers from Kings College London, Newcastle University, University College London, Warwick University, and the University of Surrey, as well as NHSE London Region, the South East London Cancer Alliance, Josephine Ruwende (joint Screening and Immunisation Lead for London), local GPs, and cancer leads.
- Full ethical approval has been obtained from the NHS Research Ethics Committee and the Confidentiality Advisory Group (CAG) under section 251 support to process confidential patient information without consent.

What is involved:

- All costs incurred by GP practices including time will be covered (based on a costing tool provided by the Clinical Research Network).
- Participating GP practices will be asked to search for eligible participants at their practice) and send the list to iPLATO (search terms will be provided).
- iPLATO will randomise participants (to either the usual text message reminder or enhanced version) and deliver the text messages.

- Afterwards, participating GP practices will be asked to provide data including cervical screening attendance for each participant and send their anonymised data back to us. As this is pilot study, we do not anticipate the numbers to be processed at each practice to be high our total sample size is 88.
- Participants will be able to opt-out of the study in various ways until the trial period has ended.
