

NEL Cancer Alliance Primary Care Update March / April 2025

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1 Important update on cancer alliance GP leads

Our GP contracts via NEL ICB ended on the 31 March. Going forwards, the cancer alliance will have two GP leads as part of the team. Sheraz Younas is the project lead for FDS and the primary care lead for Diagnosis and Treatment, and Jyoti Sood is the primary care lead for Early Diagnosis, as well as leading on the NEL Cancer Academy. We will continue to work closely with place-based leads, as well as our clinical leads across the system.

2 Barts Health NHS Trust for Non-Specific Symptom (NSS) referrals

3 Targeted Lung Health Check Programme name change

The Targeted Lung Health Check Programme changed its name to **Lung Cancer Screening** from 1 April 2025.

While the name and logo are different, nothing else has changed. The Lung Cancer Screening programme's aims are still to help diagnose lung cancer and other cardiovascular and respiratory diseases earlier, when treatment may be simpler and more successful.

Our latest figures show a very positive lung cancer screening attendance rate of 61%, which is currently above the national average and also the highest against other London ICBs. Since going live, we have diagnosed over 100 lung cancers, with 84 (76%) in stages 1 or 2.

4 Breast screening for women with a Severe Mental Illness (ONEL only)

All BHR PCNs are now launched!! Thank you to all PCNs and practices for their efforts and participation.

Since launching in October 2024, there has been a 3% reduction in unscreened SMI patients across BHR in 5 months (In April 2024, when this project was initially due to launch, it had taken 1 year to achieve this same shift!). Please continue to encourage practices to undertake their LIS activities to increase patient engagement and enable payment.

LIS activity will continue to be monitored across PCNs and practices on a monthly basis until September 2024. Please keep an eye on updates in the next PCN newsletter and via email.

IMPORTANT UPDATE: It has been identified that patients that are newly eligible for breast screening (i.e have just turned 50) will **not** be eligible for a screening appointment by the breast screening service until they have received their national screening letter.

These patients will be highlighted to practices by InHealth when they send their list for sense-checking, and they can continue to have the endorsement letter sent to them and the phone call assessment made (but should not have the outcome sent to InHealth).

This has been proven to increase the likelihood of attendance and patients should be informed that they will receive their letter in the next 2 years. Updated service specifications will be circulated to reflect this.

Please ensure practices receive and consult the updated service spec as this provides all the guidance required to carry out the project. Apologies for any inconvenience this may cause.

8 Teledermatology at the Homerton and City and Hackney

We have introduced a digital platform called Isla to the skin cancer referral pathway for Homerton and City and Hackney to help ensure that patients with suspected skin cancer receive timely care while reducing routine referral wait times. It uses visual data image capture for routine and urgent suspected referrals to be processed more efficiently.

11 GPs in City and Hackney are taking part in a pilot and have gone live for both routine referrals and for urgent suspected referrals. We will update you on the results of the pilot in due course.

9 Skin analytics diagnostics service in Barking and Dagenham

As well as the project outlined above, an exciting new pilot has gone live in Barking & Dagenham. A new AI-assisted skin lesion diagnostic service is being piloted in Barking and Dagenham, in partnership with Together First CIC, the North East London Cancer Alliance, and Skin Analytics.

This innovative service aims to improve patient care and reduce skin cancer wait times by decreasing the number of benign referrals to the urgent suspected skin cancer pathway. The service is available across all 32 GP practices in Barking & Dagenham.

10 Life After Cancer

Life after Cancer provides free, fully funded services to support patients in north east London navigating life after cancer, with the goal of reducing isolation and improving mental wellbeing.

Life after Cancer brings people together who have finished cancer treatment to form support groups, with an aim to increase their physical, mental, emotional and social wellbeing. The support they receive reduces the risk of serious mental distress and helps them to build a positive life after their cancer experience.
