6 Breast screening for women with an SMI (BHR only)

Thank you to all PCNs and practices for their efforts and participation.

Since launching in October 2024, there has been a 3.7% reduction in unscreened SMI patients across BHR in 5 months. Please continue to encourage practices to undertake their LIS activities to increase patient engagement and enable payment. LIS activity will continue to be monitored across PCNs and practices on a monthly basis until September 2025.

Please keep an eye on updates in the next PCN newsletter and via email.

IMPORTANT UPDATE: It has been identified that the number of Outcome letters carried out and the number of 'DNA breast screening' results do not reflect the number of referrals received and appointments carried out by InHealth. The CEG template will be updated to ensure that practices do not enter any results on the 'Results/Outcome' page of the CEG template.

Please only use this template for ONEL SMI breast screening project. Updated service specifications will be circulated to reflect this.

Please ensure practices receive and consult the updated service spec as this provides all the guidance required to carry out the project.

The PCN cancer facilitator will begin working with practices that remain inactive or have inaccurate data in due course.

7 Gypsy, Roma and Traveller project

Friends, Families and Travellers and Roma Support Group have successfully recruited and trained 14 health champions for the GRT communities in NEL and we introduced them to all ICB, Primary Care and Public Health teams at our online event on 14th May.

The session was recorded and will be shared later, and any work identified for the champions will be followed up in due course. Following this the champions will be receiving training on the 3 national screening programmes, representing their communities at a focus group for evaluation report and supporting the cultural awareness sessions for social prescribers and GP receptionists.
